1929 CLASS RING

The upper right hand portion of our "Coat of Arms 1941" for the Parma Senior High School, bears the inscription that appeared on our first class ring of 1929. Edward Cudlin, Class of 1928 was the artist for the "High Spot" our school newspaper, at the time and he was chosen by the committee to draw up the final drawing for our first ring to be made and available for purchase by our 56 seniors. I do not recall whether or not the ring was available to the class of 1928. Someone else will have to help me at this point. I still have my class ring and at my death it will become the property of the Parma Senior

tour of the building and dinner with former Hall of Fame members attending (see the article in this paper). February found two teachers in the Parma Cluster awarded teacher grants of \$300 from the Alumni Assoc. for use of materials in the classrooms. In May, 6 graduating seniors who also have a parent that is an alum, were awarded \$1000 scholarships from the Association. The class of 1965 also awarded a \$1000 scholarship.

May 2006 saw the dedication of the Alumni Bell Tower and chimes. A plaque, honoring Parma Sr. High Alumni association members for their distinguished service was dedicated. The late Lee Bailey, our past Treasurer and historian, was named the first recipient of this honor for his years of dedicated service. It was nice that Lee could attend and receive this award. Lee was our oldest active alum at 95 - he graduated from Ridge Road High in 1929 - the current Board Office. The bell tower digitally chimes the Alma Mater at 2:47 PM as the students are leaving the school at the end of the day. The golf outing was again held at Ridgewood Golf Course. This year we had 110 golfers join in on a day of networking and bounding. We were able to raise enough to again be able to award 6 \$1000 scholarships for this coming year's seniors.

This year's Annual meeting was also held at Schaaf Community Center with the election of board members and officers. Homecoming will be held September 29th, 2006, against Normandy. We will again have the white tent on Day Dr. at Byers Field. Free tickets for the game are available in this issue and also at the tent. Join us again for free refreshments, mums, and renewing friendships before the game.

The PSH Alumni Association in cooperation with the administration of PSH and the classes of 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006, will contribute funds to purchase a digital electronic sign for the front of the building. The sign will be two sided and will face at a 90degree angle to W 54th Street. The sign will display upcoming school events, student and school honors, testing dates, and other important school dates. high tech computer classrooms and a media center of adequate size for today's internet savvy students.

- The once vocational horticultural area, most recently science laboratories, will be converted into guidance and unit offices.
- The welding shop in the back vocational wing will be converted into a warehouse area to house district-wide supplies and materials. Welding courses will still be offered in a renovated lab area in the industrial arts wing.
- The first floor will be converted into office space to house the district's administrative offices. Beginning in 2007 the administration offices will move from the Ridge Road site to Parma Senior High. The administration offices (The Stuart L. Openlander Administration Center) housed in the former Ridge Road School will be sold or leased. Byers Field and the Transportation Department will remain on Day Drive.

In addition to the changes outlined above, much of Parma Senior High School will have been upgraded including the restrooms, the wiring and classroom facilities. Although change is occurring, Parma Senior High will remain a vital and important part of the district, the flagship school.

Once the construction is completed, I will invite you to return to your school, memories in hand, and view her as the new and improved Parma Senior High School. I look forward to meeting you personally at that time.
