Recipes from the PSH cooking class

This recipe was sent in as a response to a request sent by Sherly Haag Dilks '67. She asked for the recipe for Raisin Bubble Buns that she made in cooking class at PSH. Linda Krakora Mokos '66 sent it to us. We thank you for your recipe and the time you spent finding this old recipe.

RAISIN BUBBLE BUNS

Pette Raisin Rouleaux (basic dough) 2C sifted flour 1/3 C shortening ^{1/4} C sugar 2/3 C seedless raisins 3 t. baking powder 1 egg 1 t. salt ^{1/2} C milk Sift flour sugar baking powder and

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt together in a mixing bowl. Cut in shortening until particles are the size of small peas; add raisins and mix lightly. Beat egg and milk and combine with dry mixture, stirring until well blended. Turn out on a lightly floured board and turn dough over several times to flour surface lightly.

MAKING THE BUNS

- 1/4 C melted butter or margarine
- 1 t. cinnamon
- 1/2 C. sugar
- 1/2 t. nutmeg

Divide basic dough into 4 equal parts. On a slightly floured board, shape into a slender roll 15 in. long. Pinch off dough in ½ in. (or slightly smaller) pieces. Dip each piece lightly in melted butter. Then roll in a mixture of sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg.

Pile 4 small balls in each in each greased muffin cup. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 15 minutes or until crusty and brown. Makes about 2 - dozen.

I gave Mary Jane a government form to fill out and mail to the U.S. Marines office in St. Louis to get Frank's WWII Medals. Almost a year and a half later, the U.S. Navy sent her the medals. When I visited her to see the medals on November 1, 2006, Inga was there (George had died on September 21, 2006) as was Norma Nemeth (formerly Thomas, class of '41 and widow of Joe Nemeth, class of '40.) Joe was in the Battle of the Bulge in Europe. He was awarded the Purple Heart and the French Cruix de Guerre. He died on June 2, 2004. We enjoyed viewing Frank's medals along with a lively discussion of those golden days at Parma High.
