

#### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK Crises at Parma Senior High - Update Anthony DeMarco '62

Dating back to 1921, Parma High School has met many daunting challenges and we have overcome them. Today Parma Senior High and the Parma Sr. High Alumni Association face a new challenge - will Parma High School be here for another 89 years? The school systems financial problems have led to major cuts in the program at PSHS. Recent cuts from the arts, to physical education, to every academic department, have left a shell of a high school curriculum. The sports, music, band, choral groups, drama, and all extra curricular activities are now not just pay to play, they must be self funded. That means that the students and booster clubs for each activity must raise all the money to pay for them. Students may pay as much as \$750 to participate. They pay for equipment, all the salaries for coaches, choral /band/ drama directors, yearbook and newspaper advisors, and all other paid supplementals for extra curricular activities. Bus transportation to and from events must also be paid. In sports, teams must pay for the referees', transportation, event rental of some facilities to play the games. For most activities, students and the boosters clubs may not be able to raise enough money through fund raisers and fees.

Students are now forced to take classes at Tri C College to meet some of the requirements to get a diploma with *honors*, advanced placement or just to meet some college entrance requirements. The course offerings at PSHS are almost at state minimums now and class sizes are increasing.

A hot fourth quarter by senior guard, Justin Roth, helped propel Parma past host Strongsville, 79-68, Tuesday night in a Northeast Ohio Conference crossover boys' basketball upset.

The previously unbeaten Mustangs, ranked No. 5 in The Plain Dealer poll, led after three quarters, 52-49, but the Redmen outscored Strongsville, 30-16, in the final eight minutes.

Roth had a game-high 33 points, and 18 came in the fourth quarter. Parma also had good shooting from senior guard George Blake, who had 21 points on just six field goals, all from beyond the 3-point line.

## Three More 2009 PSH Alumni Association Hall Of Fame Inductees Biographies By Gil Fritzsche '65 and Marilyn Marquette Coleman '53

## Michael Jaszczak (Class of 1980)

Michael Jaszczak is first and foremost a marvelous teacher. A talented artist in his own right, Michael teaches art and oversees the Art Department of Parma Senior High School as department head. Student work is continuously displayed throughout the building, keeping the art program in the mainstream of the curriculum and drawing recognition to student works of art. Many of Michael's students have received awards at the local, state and national level.

Mr. Jaszczak is the yearbook advisor. Michael challenges himself and his students to produce a yearbook that exceeds the quality of the previous year's yearbook.

Michael is widely recognized as an outstanding artist and displays his work at various galleries. Enameling is a medium at which he excels. The mace adorning the Alumni Hall of Fame is an example of the manner in which Michael illustrates to his students the relevancy of art in the real world. The mace is borne by a retiring staff member as he or she leads the procession of faculty and graduating seniors into the auditorium at our annual commencement ceremony.

Michael maintains a leadership position in the Parma Education Association. In that capacity, Michael devotes a great deal of time and effort to facilitate a positive work climate in the best interests of staff, students, and administration.

One of the most important accomplishments of Michael Jaszczak is the 2004 edition of the Parma Senior High School Spectrum. The book marked the fiftieth anniversary of the opening of the building.

Michael donates his time and skills to PSH Alumni projects and to beautify the PSH building.

## Mickey Vittardi (Class of 1978)

Mickey Vittardi graduated from Cuyahoga Community College with an Associate of Arts degree and began his professional life as a sales account representative with the Cleveland Cavaliers. He later served in the same capacity with the Sun Newspapers. It was in 1988 that he found his niche and began a distinguished career in public service when he became Parks and Recreation Supervisor for the City of Parma. He is responsible for the organization and supervision of all city athletic programs. Anyone who has participated in any of the recreation programs under the auspices of the city of Parma, has Mickey Vittardi to thank for that opportunity.

Beyond the scope of job responsibilities, Mickey Vittardi has generously devoted his time and talent to countless committees and organizations for the betterment of his community. Mickey is, or has been, a member of the Byers Field Foundation, the Captain James Lovell Park Renovation Committee, the Community Leadership Group, the Parma Amateur Athletic Federation, the Continuous Improvement Planning Committee for Athletics in the Parma City School District, and the Ohio Parks and Recreation Association. He is the founder and current commissioner of the Tri-City Youth Football League and the Director of the local Punt, Pass, and Kick Competition. Through the efforts of Mickey Vittardi, Parma was selected to host the prestigious Ohio Challenger Little League Baseball Tournament this past summer at the Veterans Memorial Park. The program's fundamental goal is to give everyone a chance to play, regardless of limitations.

The Parma Amateur Athletic Federation inducted Mickey into the Parma Sports Hall of Fame in 2000. As part of the Parma High School Golden Anniversary celebration in 2003, Mickey Vittardi was named to the Parma



1970 All Decades Football Team. He played on the Amateur Softball Association Men's "A" Softball National Championship Team. He was a Men's Softball All American from 1981 through 2000. In 2008 the Parma Elks Lodge 1938 named Mickey Vittardi "Outstanding Citizen of the Year".

## Ronald B. Hutchings (Class of 1952)

The late Ronald Hutchings is remembered by his schoolmates as an outstanding athlete, a student leader, and a person admired by all who knew him. He devoted his life to public service, generously giving of his time and talent to a wide variety of community organizations. Mr. Hutchings actively participated in YMCA, Indian Guides, coaching, several professional organizations, and served as a Sunday School teacher at All Saints Episcopal Church. He attended Case Western Reserve University and Cuyahoga Community College.

Ronald Hutchings' main calling, however, was that of firefighter. "Hutch", as he was known to his friends, joined the Parma Heights Fire Department in 1955 as a "paid on call" fire fighter and was quickly appointed full-time status with the department. He rose steadily through the ranks to the position of fireman, Lieutenant, Captain, and ultimately he became Fire Chief in 1979. Under his leadership a paramedic program was initiated and he was instrumental in the development of the Southwest Area HasMat (Hazardous Material) Team. The degree of respect in which he was held by his peers is evidenced by the facts he served as Secretary of the Northeast Fire Prevention Association and two terms as President of the Northeastern Ohio Fire Chiefs' Association. Chief Hutchings retired from the Parma Heights Fire Department in 1992, but remained active. Chief Hutchings was elected Secretary/Treasurer of the Great Lakes Division of the International Association of Fire Chiefs in 1994. He served in this position until his death in 2007, at which time he was bestowed the title of Secretary/Treasurer Emeritus, a significant honor awarded to only a very few individuals.

Ronald Hutchings is what we call today an "Every Day Hero", remembered fondly as an intelligent, wise, warm and cheerful, "the kind of person you wanted to be around.
