The PSH Alumni Assoc. will be awarding 9 \$1000.00 scholarships and 2 \$1500.00 Scholarships to deserving Parma Sr. High School seniors this May. These scholarships were provided by the PSH Alumni Golf Outing Scholarship Fundraiser, the Golden Redmen Reunion for classmates who have celebrated their 50th Reunion, Class of 1962 55th Class Reunion, 3 individual donors who donated \$5000.00 in Scholarships, and a number of smaller individual donations toward these scholarships. These students were awarded these scholarships on the basis of their academic success, their community service, their extra curricular activities and their work ethic. If we were in the halls, we were to crouch down next to the wall and cover our heads. The fears of that day slowly disappeared over the years until the next crises, the Cuban Missile Crises of October 1962. That crises ended when the Russian ships caring missiles turned backfrom Cuba. Many parents kept their children out of school during the last days of that crises. They even packed their cars with food, water, blankets, and other essentials for a fast exit to the farmland south of Cleveland.

Today with all the fears about their school aged children, they now have to worry about mass shootings in their schools. Something that we thought could never happen is now on every student, parents and grandparents mind.

Soon students will be participating in protocol lock down drills. Some school districts, across the country, may soon be looking at the A.L.I.C.E protocol program (which stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) as a way to deal with this problem.

We have always had bullies, disruptive students and other problems with students in our schools which need to be addressed, but this is something totally different. This is something that strikes fear in our students and parents like never before. A shooter in our schools.


### New Superintend

On March 1, 2018, the Parma City School District Board of Education approved Resolution 2018-03-89, <sup>3</sup>Resolution to Appoint and Employ Superintendent of Schools.<sup>2</sup> The Board of Education approved the appointment of Dr. Charles Smialek as superintendent, beginning on August 1, 2018. Dr. Smialek currently serves as the Superintendent of the Euclid City School District in Euclid, Ohio. The Euclid Schools serves approximately 5,300 students in seven buildings. Dr. Smialek is also a proud graduate of the Euclid City Schools.

Dr. Smialek earned his bachelor<sup>1</sup>s degree in history from Ohio State University in 1998. He then earned his master<sup>1</sup>s degree in teaching from Kent State University in 1999, focusing on secondary social studies. In 2008, he earned his doctorate in Educational Leadership from Kent State University. Dr. Smialek was named assistant superintendent of the Euclid Schools beginning in 2015. In July 2016, he was named Superintendent.

Also at the March 1 regular meeting, retiring Superintendent Carl Hilling was praised for doing an outstanding job given the tough circumstances the district has been in. He was thanked and recognized for his dedicated service to the Parma Schools.
