A change in the Fall Tradition in 2009

In 1995 we had decided that it was time for the Parma Sr. High Alumni Association to produce a newsletter that would be sent to every PSH Alumni. The name would be the *Tradition*. I selected that name because I wanted to have a name that reflected the importance of the history of the three schools that made up Parma High School – Parma Ridge Road High School, Parma Schaaf High School, and Parma Senior High School. Those Schools represented 85 years and 39,000 graduates who believed in the traditions that are part of their history.

We had a current database, at the time, of about 25,000 names and addresses. It was our hope that we could send the fall edition to every alumnus and that a large number of you would also subscribe to the 3 additional issues we planned for the first year. We knew that this would be an expensive undertaking, but we felt that the time had come to let everyone know that the PSH Alumni Association was very much alive and we were here to let you know what was happening now at PSH, what was our past history, and what we were planning for the future. The first edition came out in September of 1995 and over a thousand of you subscribed to the 3 issues that would follow in 1996.

For the last 13 years we have brought you a great deal of information about the history of Parma High, the PSH Alumni Association, fellow alumni, and the current PSH students and events. We want to continue that tradition and we will, but in a slightly different form. You are our most valued constituency because you are subscribers. For that reason we are letting you know of our plans now.

First: Let me make it very clear that your subscriptions will be honored no matter how long they are for. You will receive a hard copy of the *Tradition* through the US mail.

Second: The fall 2008 edition of the *Tradition* will be the last issue to be sent, as a hard copy, to every PSH Alumnus that we have a current address for on our database. Starting in 2009, we will post the fall *Tradition* on our web page so everyone can read and download to their computer or print their own hard copy on their home printer.

Third: We will continue to offer subscriptions of all the issues for each year (fall, winter, spring and any special editions) to anyone who subscribes for the *Tradition* in a hard copy form. Those subscriptions will be sent by US mail to every subscriber. The price of the subscriptions will remain the same -1 year \$6, 2 years \$11, 3 years \$15.

Fourth: The reason we are doing this is because of the cost. The cost of the 2007 fall edition, which went out to over 25,500 alumni members, came to over \$7,000. The cost of our bulk-mailing rate, the cost of paper, and the cost of printing, has increased almost every year.

Robert Brugge 1944

Robert Brugge passed away January 2, 2008. Bob had been ill for the past few years and was in a nursing home. Bob was a 1944 graduate of Parma Schaaf High School. He was one of the greatest athletes to ever come out of Parma High. He was an all Big 10 running back for Ohio State and he was the most successful Parma High football coach with 4 consecutive Lake Erie League championships and 2 undefeated seasons. He taught in the Parma System for 30 years in health and physical education and retired in 1981. He was one of the founders, past president and long time board member of the Parma School Employees Credit Union. He will be missed.

School News Parma Football

Parma Sr. High had a great season this past fall. The Redmen went 7 and 3 and missed the state district playoffs by only a few points. The 5-9 185- pound star running back, Tim Miker, was named to an all state team and had one of the best seasons any running back has ever had at PSH with over 1500 yards rushing. Miker had 1224 yards rushing, 15 touchdowns on 196 carries, and 700 yards as a receiver/kickoff/punt returner as a Jr. The highlight of the year were back to back victories against N Royalton at homecoming – undefeated at the time and ranked in the state rankings – and the victory over arch rival Valley Forge by 1 point in the last game of the year.

PARMA HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES FOR 2007

The Parma Sr. High Alumni Association had its' bi-annual induction on November 9th 2007 of 5 new members to the Parma High School Alumni Association Hall of Fame. The new members included Robert Bolton '57, Robert Brugge'44, Karen Spillner Dendorpher '57, Norman W Shibley '39, and Dave Smallwood '68. These Alumni were nominated by fellow classmates and selected by a committee co-chaired by Marilyn Marquette Coleman '53 and Gil Fritzsche '65. The all day event included a morning induction assembly where the inductees were introduced to the Senior and Jr. classes of PSH. Each inductee gave a brief speech on how PSH helped them to become what they are today and the importance of giving back to your community and society in general. The inductees were presented the large hanging plaque, which will become part of the permanent display of the 47 Hall of Fame inductees. This was followed by a breakfast and a tour of the building.

The evening presentation dinner was held at the Red Rees room at PSH. One hundred guests, past inductees gathered to honor the 5 new inductees. Each inductee was presented a small plaque and given time to speak to those gathered. We want to thank Sharon Arko Jones '67, Barb Tomc Filipow '61, Nancy Fedak '66 and Tony DeMarco '62 for all their help. Here are the new inductees.

Robert Bolton Class of 1957 Parma Senior High

Bob Bolton is married to his seventh grade sweetheart Jada Rae and resides in Parma Hts. He and Jada have 2 sons ...Scott-a fireman in Brookpark, OH and Buddy - a teacher at

Valley Forge.

It is interesting to observe how often times a person's high school experiences shape his/her future both personally and professionally. Mr. Bolton exhibited the love for athletic competition, as well as the integrity and the leadership characteristics that proved to be so much in evidence throughout his career.

Bob was an outstanding athlete at PSH in the mid 1950s. He played baseball (3 years –captain-all league-Most Valuable Player his senior year). He played basketball (Sportsmanship Award). He played varsity football for 2 years (captain his Sr. year and honored with the Sportsmanship Trophy). He was given the senior citation of Most Athletic. Outside the realm of athletics, he participated in the Canteen Committee, which planned school dance, and the Boys Leaders Club, of which he was President.

Bob attended Bowling Green State University where he earned a BS degree in 1962 and a MS degree in 1964 in the fields of PhysEd and Earth Science. He played 3 years of varsity baseball and was elected Co-captain his senior year. He served in the Army from 1962-1964. Bob began his professional career in athletics as BGSU Varsity Assistant Baseball coach and Head Freshman baseball coach.

Mr. Bolton's distinguished career as a teacher and administrator for the Parma School District spanned 31 years from 1965 to 1996. Since 1996 Bob has continued to serve the school district and the community in a wide variety of capacities. In addition to coaching, he served as: Assistant Principal of Shiloh Jr. High School

- Supervisor of Health and Physical Education and Athletics for 18 years Chairman of the Ohio Schools Council Cooperative Purchasing
- Active Trustee on the Board of the Friends of Byers Field Foundation
- Part of the movement to install the artificial surface for Byers Field
- Recreation Department for 30 years with the city of Parma
- Director of hardball city of Parma Pride award winner from the Parma Area
- Chamber of Commerce 1996
- President of the Muny Athletic Association of Parma
- Presently: Supervisor of Athletics/Director of Interscholastic Operations

For many years Mr. Bolton has been the face and the heart of Parma Athletics. To state it succinctly, "If you have ever participated in sports at any leveling in the schools or community, you owe Mr. Boulton a debt of gratitude for the opportunity."

Robert Brugge Class of 1944 Parma Schaaf High School

Robert married his high school sweetheart Lois Katzbach '46. They have 3 children, 11 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Bob was a very good student while attending high school. Bob lettered in 4 sports while in high school and was selected as the most athletic his senior year. He is one of Parma's most famous high school athletes. Bob was active in a number of school activities and received a full scholarship to the Ohio State University.

He started at Ohio State in 1944 on the varsity Football team as a freshman and they had an undefeated team that year. World War II caused an interruption in his college career. He served 2 years of active duty in the Navy. He returned to OSU and graduated in 1949. During his years at Ohio State, he earned All Big 10 and All American honors as a running back. In 1949 he was drafted by the Cleveland Browns professional football team. Unfortunately for Bob, he suffered a career ending injury in his first year. Bob then returned to his Alma Mater PHS, and began his teaching career. Bob taught health and physical education for 30 years.

Bob began coaching football as an assistant and then head coach for Parma High for 16 years. As the head coach, he was instrumental in the building of Byers Field. He was the driving force in getting Parma High into the Lake Erie League. He guided Parma to 4 consecutive LEL championships from 1958 to 1961. He had a number of players receive scholarships to colleges all over the country and he hade 2 all state players and a number of honorable mention players. He also had 2 undefeated seasons and a 25 game winning streak.

After his coaching career, he started a class that worked with special needs students before there was a special needs program in the Parma Schools. He worked with these students to find jobs, keep bank accounts, and ways of helping students become self-sufficient after high school. He was the first one to teach the course and to make house calls to help the parents with these students. Most of the students at that time would not graduate, so this class was very important for them. Bob retired from teaching in 1981.

Bob's community service included helping to start the Parma School Employees Credit Union, which helped so many teachers, fireman; police and hospital employees get education, car, and home loans. He served as President and was on the board of directors for many years.

Karen Spillner Dendorfer Class of 1957 Parma Senior High School

Karen is married to John Dendorfer (PSH '56) and they have 4 children and

9 grandchildren. While a student at PSH, Mrs. Dendorfer was active and participated in Y-Teens. As her children came of school age, Karen became actively involved with the Parent Teacher Association. She first joined the PTA at Arlington Elementary School in 1965. Quick to identify a leader when they see one, the various PTA's with which she was affiliated soon placed her in an officer position within the group. Mrs. Dendorfer served as President for the following: Parma Park PTA: Crile Elementary School (twice), Pleasant Valley Junior High PTA, Valley Forge PTA, Parma council of PTA's.

Her personality and sound leadership ability came to the attention of district and state PTA officers and she rose through the ranks of statewide PTA positions. Mrs. Dendorfer served in the following capacities: Ohio PTA Board of Manager, District 12 Director and Ohio PTA Treasurer. For her devotion to the education of children she received both Ohio PTA Life Achievement Award and National PTA Life Achievement Award.

In 1987 Mrs. Dendorfer was elected to the first of several terms on the Parma City Schools Board of Education. As a board member, Mrs. Dendorfer was directly involved in many decisions that shaped our school district and supported many projects to enhance the learning opportunities of students in our district in regard to policies, procedures, curriculum, and facilities. Most recently, Mrs., Dendorfer presided over \$44 million worth of building renovations since 2002. Her kind, gentle demeanor belies the fierce determination with which she advocates for students in the local, state, and national arenas. She has been: Actively involved with the Ohio School Board Association, Federal Relations Network (1992-present), Northeast Region Executive Committee (2002-presnet and Legislative Platform Committee (2004present). She was the recipient of: OSBA Award of Achievement 2005 and 2007, OSBA Master Boardsmanship Award (2005), Active Member of the Back the Schools committee, which is dedicated to providing resources to support local school levies.

Mrs. Dendorfer has lobbied at the state and national levels for projects and programs beneficial to students in her home district and students across the country. She was featured in the Ohio School Board Journal seeking support from Congressman, Dennis Kucinich for the "Pledge of American School Children".

Married to John Dendorfer (PSHS Class of '56). She is the mother of 4 children, Kevin, Brian, Donna, and Susan (all products of Parma City Schools) and 9 grandchildren.

David Smallwood Class of 1988 Parma Senior High

While in school Mr. Smallwood was a member of the wrestling, basketball and baseball

teams. He was a member of the Hi-Y club and he served as a hall monitor. Dave is married to Barb Snowden (Class of 1968) and they have 3 children and 6 grandchildren. Dave is employed by the Cutler Hammer Division of Eaton Corp, where he was recognized as the national Salesman of the Year in 2006. Dave is a true community activist. He was elected to the Parma School Board for 2 terms and served 2 years as President. He was a member of the Back the Schools Committee and worked on many of the levy campaigns. He served on the Byers field foundation and is the current Vice President. Other community activities include serving as site coordinator for the Relay for Life Charity and he was co-chair in 2007 and in 2006 when a record of \$200,000 was raised. His other activities include working on the Rib and Rock fundraiser for the Parma Chamber of Commerce, volunteering for the Indian Guides and Indian Princesses. He also umpires high school baseball and softball games as well as officiating high school volleyball games. There is no question Dave Smallwood is a person who cares about his community and because of the efforts you live in a better place.

Norman Shibley class of 1939 Parma Schaaf High School

In his years at Parma Schaaf High School, Mr. Shibley was a member of the National Honor Society, participated in drama, band

(president), student council (president), music council (vice-president), basketball, and junior class president. It seems that early on Mr. Shibley exhibited the charisma and leadership traits that would be hallmarks of his career. The yearbook back then placed a quote selected by each student next to his or her picture. Mr. Shibley's quote, "I am not arguing with you, I am telling you." prophetically characterized the confidence with which he practiced law in his career as an attorney. Each of us leaves our mark on Parma High School, but Mr. Shibley's mark will endure as long as this high school exists. When he was sophomore at Parma Schaaf High School, he wrote and scored the lyrics for the Parma High School Alma Mater. If you look carefully, you will see his name credited on the sign bearing the words to our Alma Mater posted in the gymnasium. Majoring in music at Ohio State University, Mr. Shibley paid his tuition by playing clarinet and piano at dances and nightclubs. He had a weekly jazz radio show and toured with the Ohio State University Symphonic Orchestra. Mr. Shibley was an imposing figure of a man. Standing 6'5" and weighing more than

300 pounds, his physical presence was well matched in the dimension of his personal and professional achievements. With his sharp legal mind and jovial sense of humor he dominated a courtroom, a boardroom, or a social gathering. He served as an Army Field Artillery Office in the Pacific Theater during World Was II and after the war he graduated cum laude from the Ohio State College of Law in 1948. Over the course of his career in law, he served as President of the Ohio and Greater Cleveland Bar Associations. He was one of the founders and original officers of the Parma Bar Association in 1963. Mr. Shibley served as President of the Parma City Schools Board of Education in the 1950's and 60's when the district was growing by leaps and bounds. In that capacity he introduced Russian to the foreign language curriculum. Under his direction, Parma was one of the first school districts in the nation to develop the concept of district-wide closed circuit television throughout our schools. He proposed the annual trip to Washington, DC to bring history to life for eighth grad students. Mr. Shibley was President of Parma Community Hospital, President of Ohio Association of Trail Lawyers, President of Ohio State Law School Alumni and Chairman of the American College of Trial Lawyers. He was the first law director of Parma Hts, and author of the charter for that city. He was also active in the American Legion and Chairman of the Lawyers Gourmet Club. Mr. Shibley was a voracious reader. He read all of the legal periodicals and lectured to the Bar Association each year on new developments in civil practice. He was highly respected as a mentor to many young lawyers and urged them to strive for the highest standards of ethics and excellence. Mr. Shibley approached retirement with the same vision and energy that characterized his career. He had 3 goals for his retirement. He wanted to write a book, sail around the world in a steamer, and play the piano in a small Italian restaurant in Sarasota, FL. Stricken with heart problems just weeks after retiring, he did complete a small volume of vignettes, which he circulated among his friends. Mr. Shibley passed away December 6, 1992. He was married to Jeanne for 29 years. They raised 3 children, Jeff (Tampa, FL), Linda Hovan (Strongsville), and Sharon Hiller (Lorain). They have 6 grandchildren and 2 greatgrandchildren. Personally and professionally, Mr. Shibley lived the words contained in the last line of the Alma Mater he wrote: "Parma High Our Promise is Loyalty Eternally".
