The Archival Room - Progress

The Archival Room has been moving along at a steady pace. To date, we have painted the room and brought in some furniture. We still have a long way to go before we can open to the student body, but we are making progress. One of the hardest things to do is sort through all the material that has been left to the Alumni Association. Much of the material was never labeled with dates or where it came from, so it is very difficult to say what erait came from. We are still looking for more donations to add to the collection. We ask that when you send materials like photographs, which is our greatest need, you give us the date, the place, the names of the people in the picture, and the event if any. So far we have a band uniform with tall fur hat, a number of graduation and prom keepsakes, bronze plaques, class photographs, girls leaders scrape books, books of every kind and hundreds of identified and unidentified photographs. We may try to identify some of the pictures we have by asking alumni to identify pictures we place on line. Our first task is to give some order to our collection and then do our first display. The Archival Room will always be a work in progress so we will have more information in each issue.

Did You Know?

Next to Ohio, Florida has the most Parma High graduates living in the state. I bring that fact up because I was asked at the Class of 1979 class reunion where most of the grads from PSH are living. The on line directory has listed by state all of the grads living there no matter when they graduated.

Parma Schools

The Parma Schools are once again in financial trouble. Because of failed levys, the Parma schools are making drastic cuts in art and music and increasing the cost of the pay-to-play program. It will now cost from \$300 to \$1050 to play a sport depending on the sport and the number of players. The marching band will also have to pay to play at football games and almost every extra curricular activity will come with a cost to the students. The media center will lose most of its' full time staff and transportation will be cut. A total of 53 teachers and 2 administrators were reduced at the end of the last school year The teachers and the administration are in negotiations for a new contract. The old contract has expired.

Alumni Donation

The Alumni Association will donated, as we have in the past, to school activities like the newspaper, the music club, the yearbook, student council, boosters clubs, and the after-prom committee. We will also donate to the media center for the purchase of educational books and magazines for this year.

Alumni Reunion Report

A total of 7 reunion committees requested class funds for reunions this past year. We gave 2 tours of the building and had representitives at 3 of the reunions. Reunions took place at hotels, resturants, halls and lounges. The class of '94 had to cancel the Saturday event because of a small turnout. The class of '79 had a hot horsd'oeuvre instead of a sit down or buffet. A class had a problem with a DJ company(check with us on the name)and warns get a quote in writing!.
