On August 17, 2006 the Pension Protection Act of 2006 allowing individuals to donate money in an IRA to a charity, including PSH Alumni Association. The new law provides an exclusion from gross income for IRA distribution. Up to \$100,000 per year from traditional IRAs to "qualified charitable distributions" may be made during 2007. Recipes from the PSH Cafeteria

From the collection of Loretta Timchak – Cafeteria manager and cook for 40 years.

The following recipes were used until the Parma City Schools went to a satellite food service system in the 70's and early 80's. Until that time all lunches

were made from scratch and prepared daily.

Jan. 12, 1949 Corn Chowder

1/2 cup diced salt pork or 1/4 cup of bacon fat - 2 onions, sliced - 2 cups of diced potatoes - 2 cups canned corn - 4 cups boiling water - 2/3 tsp. Salt - 1 qt. milk - pepper to taste.

Cook the salt pork in a large saucepan over low heat until the fat is extracted. – Add onion and cook until the onion is yellow. – Add potatoes and water, and boil until the potatoes are tender. – Add corn and milk and reheat (taste to see if it is well seasoned).

If thickened chowder is desired, make a smooth paste with 1 tbl. flour and a little cold milk or water. Add and let cook for a few minutes more, being careful to stir to prevent scorching. Serves 6/7
