How is the fiscal condition of PSH?
 The inside of the building looks great. The terrazzo floors and the ceramic green tiles look like they did 64 years ago when the building opened in October of 1953. The PSH Auditorium which was remodeled a few years back, looks great. With new seating and restoration of the original band shell, the sound is still great. It now holds about 1300 people. It is the largest auditorium in the system
 The concrete front addition to the building has been painted for the first time in years, They patched the rebar holes that were showing through and painted an off white over the whole concrete building. 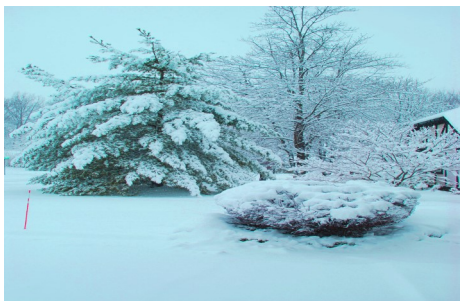

Richard L Pinkerton PSH Class of 1951 2005 PSH Hall of Fame Inductee

Richard was a 1951 graduate of Parma Schaaf High. He was in varsity football and track. He was also Student City Manager for 2 years. He attended Michigan University where he was the 55th executive Secretary of the Student Union, number two man on its Board of Directors. He is an active debater and won the State of Michigan Junior Division in the Hurst Newspaper's Tournament of Orators in 1953. His other activities included membership in the Michiganum, Toastmasters, Sphinx Air Force ROTC, Arnold Air Society, Scabbard and Blade, and Phi Gamma Delta. He graduated from The University of Michigan and the 390th AFROTC Detachment in Ann Arbor MI as a 2nd Lt. in June of 1955.

Richard's first active duty was the HQs of the 327th Fighter Group in the Air Defense Command as the Base Manpower-Organization Officer Truax Field Madison, WI. He served 2 years there. He elected to stay in the active reserves for what would be a long and distinguished career ending in 1978. After leaving active duty, he served several years Air Reserve Training Centers and in 1962 he was sent to the 179th Tac Fighter Group in the Ohio Air National Guard. This Assignment allowed Richard to work as a market research analyst for the Harris Corp and finish his MBA at Case Western Reserve. In 1966, as the Vietnam War heated up, Richard volunteered for the 1127th USAF Field Activities Group, an elite clandestine human intelligence gathering unit composed of modern day OSS types. He would no longer be able to return to his first love working with fighter pilots, but he would spend the next 10 years trying to save them. In 1969 Richard received his PhD and began a long and successful academic business schools career -U of Wisconsin, Capital in Columbus, California State U in Fresno.

Married with 2 children, Dr Pinkerton continued his Professor/ USAF careers. He worked on operation Homecoming Task Force charged with finding and bringing home POW's from SE Asia and other USAF Intelligence Service.

He retired in 1978 as a Lt Col with 22 years of Service. Family, academics, and business demands forced this difficult choice. He was awarded by a senior Air Force Col. the Meritorious Service Medal.

In 2000 he retired from Cal St. in Fresno. as Professor Emeritus. He is now retired, living in Strongsville, Ohio. He has written and collaborated on a number of books. He is active with a number of organizations and still guest lectures. He is still involved with the Alumni Assoc. and an active donor. Full details can be found in "Who's Who in America."
