March, 2003, exterior windows and doors will be replaced throughout our building. Plans call for landscaping the courtyards and revitalizing the auditorium with new seats, new carpeting, and a fresh coat of paint. Seats salvaged from the auditorium will find a new home in the Little Theater. The boy's locker room is also scheduled for renovation.

Expectations are being raised for our staff and students. Our PSHS Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) calls for increased academic rigor with special attention focused on freshmen. We know from experience that the key to high school graduation is a successful first year. Patterns of truancy and/or academic frustration established early on are very difficult to overcome. An oversight committee has been convened to supervise implementation of our CIP. This accountability measure ensures that strategies outlined in the CIP will be enacted and results measured. Our staff is also focusing on encouraging students to establish worthy career aspirations and to accept the challenge of a rigorous academic schedule to address those goals.

We join this year in the anniversary celebration of one hundred fifty years of excellence for the Parma City School District. PSHS Class of 2002 valedictorian Mary Assad developed the slogan for the yearlong festivities, "Celebrating our History, Building our Future", and classmate Kelly Savoca created the logo. At the same time, we are planning to celebrate the golden anniversary of Parma Senior High School at our present location. That anniversary will be noted throughout the 2003-04 school year. Alumni will be invited to return to their alma mater to enjoy the festivities next year.

Good things are happening at Parma Senior High School. Please support us with your attendance at our events. You will be pleased to see that Redman pride and spirit are alive and will at PSHS.

Keep The Tradition Alive

This marks the 9th year we are sending out the fall *Tradition* to all 26,000 PSH Alumni that we have current addresses for. This mailing will run about \$1800 for the printing, \$700 for the mail sorting service, and \$2500 for the bulk mailing postage – about \$5000 in all. In addition, we also

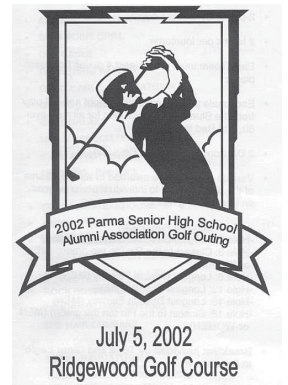

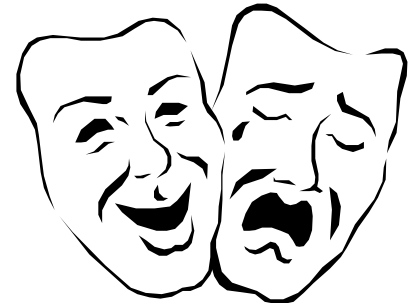

After graduating from college, I taught a year and a half in Strongsville and then became a member of the Normandy High School faculty where I taught Speech, Theatre, English, Art Seminar and Debate for five years. I was involved in theatrical activities, among other things, all of which are helpful to an actor in creating believable characters and their life experiences, which define them. During those years I worked two seasons as an acting apprentice at the Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival at Lakewood Civic Auditorium and three summers of graduate work/performance at the



Porthouse Theatre of Kent State University at Blossom Music Center. I was married for five years, and then moved to NYC in 1973 to pursue an acting career. I have been there ever since and have been fortunate enough to support myself doing the kind of work I guess I was destined to do. I am currently serving as an elected officer in two performing unions. I serve on the Board of Directors of the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists and on the Board of Directors of the Screen Actors Guild.
