# PARMA SCHOOLS POSSIBLE CONSOLIDATION PLANS BY CHARLES SMIALEK SUPERINTENDENT PARMA CITY SCHOOLS

This fall residents will provide their reactions to specifications for the Parma city Schools Campuses of the future. GPD Group and Parma schools' leaders analyzed survey data and feedback from the spring's meetings to determine the options most likely to gain consensus support. These are the options: Elementary Schools (Pre-K through 5th Grade)

Option A: Six schools
Option B: Seven schools
Option C: Eight schools

Secondary Schools (6th through 12th grade)
Option A: One high school (9-12), two middle schools (6-8)

dle schools (6-8)
Option B: Three secondary campuses, each with one 6-8 schools and one 9-12 school
Option C: Two secondary campuses, each with one 6-8 school and one 9-12 school and a separate campus for Career Technical Edcation and other district functions.

Community members will now be able to share their perspectives about the best possible models of the locations for schools.

Board President John Schweitzer explained, "The idea all along has been to consolidate the number of campuses that we operate. In each of the secondary models that we are weighing, we will be able to reduce the number of campuses we operate from six to three. On the other hand, we know from our surveys and meetings that neighborhood elementary schools are very popular. We have to determine the most appropriate number of these. We will use this fall to gain more information about what people think we should do."

The Board of Education also heard from Squire, Patton, and Boggs attorney Richard Manoloff. Mr. Manoloff explained the Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP), which the district will most likely use for funding construction if it passes a bond issue in 2020.

### Kareem "Kay" Ameen 1973

Played golf on the PSH Golf team and Bowling Green U. where he earned dual degrees in Cost Accounting and Operations Management. Upon graduation, Kay became owner of VR Business Brokers from 1980 through 1989 and owner / founder of the Amrap Café from 1989 through 1991. In 1991 Kay joined forces with his school friend and college roommate, George Schindler to create Hospitality Management and Hospitality Properties. Together they founded 9 upscale restaurants: The Cabin Club in 1981, Salmon Dave's Pacific Grill in 1993, Blue Point Grill in 1997, Thirsty Parrot in 2000, Delmonico's Steak House in 2004, Rosewood Grill in Hudson, Strongsville and Westlake in 2009 and Kingfish Seafood in 2016. As Chief Financial Officer, Kay brings analytical and logical discipline to property acquisition and big picture financial decisions. They are involved in service to every community in which they have restaurants and have been strong supporters of the Parma City Schools and the Parma Senior high School alumni Association.





### Keith Dailey PSH 1998

Keith was Class President and commencement speaker at PSHS and went on to be Student Body President and Homecoming King at Ohio Wesleyan University. He headed the governorship campaign for Governor Ted Strickland and served as Press Secretary and Senior Staff and Communications Director in the Strickland administration. Keith joined the Kroger Company in 2016 where he was promoted to the position of Vice President, Corporate Affairs. In that post he has ushered Kroger to become a national thought leader and advocate for ending hunger, eliminating waste, and other social impact endeavors through the Zero Hunger/Zero Waste Program. Keith serves on several prestigious Boards of Directors including The Center for Food Integrity, Camp Joy, and the Cincinnati Regional Business Committee. Keith utilizes the experience garnered in the political arena and corporate world to take part in community initiatives for the betterment of the community in which he resides.





#### Minor George Parma Schssf High 1940

Minor George was President of his class at Parma Schaaf High School. He was awarded a Bronze Star for valor as a Naval Officer in WWII. After beginning in the construction business with his father and brother, and developing more than 50 Parma streets, Minor and Rudy formed Broadbreck Development Corporation, the first Arab owned construction company in the state of Ohio. Minor served as Chairman of Planning Development Projects when Parma grew from 5,000 to 100,000 residents. He served 3 consecutive terms on Parma City Council and was active throughout his life in the Republican party, locally, statewide, and nationally. He worked personally with U.S. president and international leaders. He was deeply involved with the Ohio Home Builders Association and St. George Orthodox church. Minor worked side by side with Danny Thomas in the creation of St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. In the 1970's he founded the Greater Cleveland Association of Arab Americans and its national counterpart. Minor George viewed America as a "mosaic" not a melting pot, but a place where every nationality should maintain its identity in society as proud contributors society.

Brian attained the rank of Eagle Scout at 16 years of age. 
### George Schindler PSH 1973
