This marked the beginning of the most bizarre ed-ucation period of our lives. The end of 2020 saw

traditional spring events like Senior Prom can-celed. However, new traditions like drive by Graduations and birthday parades had begun. The following school year, as hard as I try to remember, is a blur. I know our administrative decision makers did the best possible job they could in the worst possible situation. could in the worst possible situation. They worked tirelessly to develop numerous plans to return to school only to quickly pivot to plans B, C and D. Our students seem to remember the sequence much better than I do. However, if memory serves, we began with a full remote schedule. I felt much more like a professional podcaster, radio host or YouTuber than I did a teacher. At some point we shifted to 'hybrid learning'. This is when half of our students were in class, socially distanced of course, and the other half were undertaking independent study at home. Later in the year I believe we transi-tioned to a new type of 'hybrid learning' in which half of the students were in school and the other half watched the live-stream version of the class. Extra-curricular activities were not unaffected. Events, if not canceled, usually had very few, to no spectators at all. I know I am likely wrong on the details and sequence of these events, But one thing was consistent, everyone longed for the social connections that we had taken for granted just a few months before. Still, there is a lesson to be learned in every situation. Today I believe even more than I ever have, that the relationships forged at Parma Senior, whether virtual or in person, are as strong today as they have ever been, More importantly, we have learned to appreciate at them even more.
