Michael Dolatowski was a 1987 graduate of PSHS. He took Enameling and Jewelry classes in Parma's Art Program. His art work won local Key awards and a Key New York. He went to the Cleveland Institute of Art and worked as a jeweler in downtown Cleveland.

In 1996 Mike and his wife Tina opened the Lion and Blue. Tina said "When we married each other, we married our talents. I previously had a shop in the Arcade and was good at managing. Michael had worked for a jeweler himself."

The result? A store that sells jewelry, obviously, but also clothing, Birkenstock, candles, books. Essential oils, decorative mirrors, incense, beautiful Turkish lamps, cards, journals, musical instruments, and more.

Michael crafts custom made Jewelry, including wedding rings to order and also repairs and redesigns pieces. Most of the other items sold in the Lion and Blue are certified fair trade and crafted by indigenous people from all over the world. They have an assortment of tiny hand -carved "spirt animals" each of which is said to represent certain talents and traits.

The stores name, like some items, is whimsical, and was inspired by a beautifully illustrated book of the same name that Tina gave Michael shortly after they met. It is a story about a lion who searches for and finds, a beautiful blue Brazilian butterfly he loves. Lion and Blue's eclecticism and a perfect place to find unique gifts and fine jewelry.

From The PSHS Athletic Director Ryan Madison



Final Score of PSHS last game Parma 20 Fairview 7

With the announcement of Parma Senior High closing after this school year inevitably came challenges for all Parma High students and staff alike. This was no exception for the Redmen Football team who were in the middle of offseason workouts when the unfortunate news broke. The Redmen were coming off one of their more successful years in recent memory under new Head Coach and 2009 PSH graduate Matt Burns. They were looking to build upon the positives from the season with a successful 2022 campaign which just also happened to be the 100th season in Parma football history.

What looked to be a promising season for the Redmen quickly became an uphill battle before they even strapped on their pads. The number of participants dropped remarkably. Many younger players decided to either not play this year or transferred to other schools because they figured there was little point in playing for a team that would not exist in their future years. The Redmen also struggled to find additions to their coaching staff, considering the circumstances. Fortunately, four PSH Alumni members were on staff to help weather this storm. Head Coach Matt Burns ('09), Offensive Coordinator Howie Spies ('82), Offensive Line Coach Ryan Madison Jr. ('19) and Outside Linebackers Coach Sebastian Spear ('16) brought passion and pride to a Parma team that certainly had more obstacles to face than most other high school football teams. The Redmen found themselves with only 42 participants from grades 9-12 by the time they had their home opener against the Fairview Warriors. At this game, they honored the 1971 and 1972 LEL Championship Teams. 1972 LEL MVP Don Homyk and future Baltimore Colts end Mike Ozdowski even came out to a practice to throw around the pigskin, tell stories, and walk on top of the same old, dusty, practice field they played on one last time.

Due to the unfortunate and unforeseen circumstances that the team faced, it was very challenging for the team to achieve victory, but that did not stop them from working hard and giving their best effort. Week after week, the Parma gridiron warriors faced challenges and adversity. In an ironic twist of events, the last game the Redmen would ever play would be the same Fairview Warriors team they fell to earlier in the year. With Parma pride heavy in their heart, and the bond of a rich fraternity of Parma football players behind them, the Redmen persevered through a season of struggle and strife.
